LPNA Business, Barbara Canup

- Newly elected District 10 Councilmember George Casey was introduced.
- Our next General Meeting is Thursday, March 20 at 7 pm. Additional dates are posted on the website.
- An election of Officers was held. A motion to elect the Slate of Officers was made and seconded. The motion passed.

- Barbara thanked Peter for his service for the past 2 years. She also stated that the Board can appoint a

- Beautify SJ Grant request was submitted. We have requested \$5,000 (April 1, 2025, to March 31, 2026) with half the funds used for August's National Night Out. Other projects include a rose garden in Los Paseos Park, our December Holiday event, and several social events.
- Barbara is seeking people with knowledge of roses or people interested in learning about roses.
 Planting will take place in January 2026.
- Our Holiday Event at the Clubhouse was a success.

District 10 Council Update by George Casey

- Geroge Casey gave a bit of background on himself and expressed his interesting in supporting neighborhood associations.
- His goals include building new neighborhood associations, strengthening south SJ business organizations and cleaning up city streets.
- Casey mentioned setting up a meeting with DOT to discuss sweeping bike lanes for bike safety.

- Casey also addressed SJ's homeless issues including the area buffers that need to be enforced. He also said there needs to be accountability on both sides of the homelessness issue and that the policies in place need to be enforced.
- Casey thanked LPNA for their efforts and said he looks forward to working with LPNA and serving the needs of District 10.

Village Hub – David Smathers Moore

- David Smathers Moore introduced the Village Hub program—a neighborhood meeting spot for gathering people, tools, and supplies during an emergency.
- The idea is simple—people sharing information and expertise that can be available at a time of need.
- There are four grass-roots basics of the Village Hub:
 - o Information and critical announcement communication
 - Connecting volunteers
 - o Supplies and equipment that are available in the area
 - o Education, including information about sanitation, water purification, etc.
- Village Hub is a complement to CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)
- HUB 101 classes, training and events will be offered in addition to hands-on practice events.
